



GLOBAL COOKIES & SIMILAR TECHNOLOGIES POLICY

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Document Status: Public Corporate Cookies Policy

Applies Globally: Subject to applicable local mandatory law

1. PURPOSE

This Global Cookies & Similar Technologies Policy explains how Engineering Projects TM LTD ("EPTM LTD") may use cookies and similar technologies on its websites, applications and digital services.

This Policy also explains the categories of technologies that may be used, the purposes for which they may be used, the methods available for managing preferences and consent, and the relationship between such technologies and applicable privacy requirements.

2. WHAT ARE COOKIES?

Cookies are small files or identifiers stored on or accessed from a user's device.

Similar technologies may include:

- local storage;
- pixels;
- tags;
- SDKs;
- device identifiers;
- session technologies;
- similar technologies used to remember settings, measure usage or protect services.

For the purposes of this Policy, references to "cookies" include similar technologies unless the context requires otherwise.

3. WHY WE USE THEM

EPTM LTD may use these technologies to:

- operate digital services;
 - maintain security;
 - remember preferences;
 - maintain sessions;
 - provide requested functionality;
 - understand how services are used;
 - diagnose technical problems;
 - improve usability;
 - measure performance;
 - support legitimate business and analytics purposes;
 - comply with legal requirements.
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4. COOKIE CATEGORIES

4.1 Strictly Necessary Technologies

These are technologies necessary for a service or functionality requested by the user or otherwise permitted without consent under applicable law.

They may support:

- authentication;
- security;
- session management;
- navigation;
- form functionality;
- load balancing;
- basic application operation.

4.2 Preference Technologies

These may remember choices such as:

- language;
- interface settings;
- display preferences;
- other requested preferences.

Where consent is legally required, these technologies shall not be activated before the required consent is obtained.

4.3 Analytics Technologies

These may help EPTM LTD understand:

- number of visitors;
- page or screen usage;
- application performance;
- navigation patterns;
- technical errors;
- service performance.

Analytics technologies shall be used in accordance with applicable law.

4.4 Marketing Technologies

EPTM LTD may use marketing-related technologies only where lawful and where the required consent or other lawful basis has been obtained.



5. TECHNOLOGY INVENTORY

EPTM LTD shall maintain an internal inventory of cookies and similar technologies used on its websites, applications and digital services.

The inventory may include:

- technology name;
- provider;
- category;
- purpose;
- duration or retention period;
- first-party or third-party status;
- consent status where applicable.

The inventory may be updated from time to time as technologies, service providers, platforms or business requirements change.

Where required by applicable law, EPTM LTD shall make appropriate information available to users regarding material technologies deployed on the relevant digital service.

6. CONSENT

Where UK law requires consent before placing or accessing non-essential cookies or similar technologies, EPTM LTD shall obtain consent before doing so.

The UK's privacy and electronic communications framework, including PECR, has been amended by the Data (Use and Access) Act 2025, with implementation occurring in stages.

Where required by applicable law:

- consent shall be freely given;
- consent shall be specific and informed;
- consent shall be obtained before activation of non-essential technologies;
- users shall be able to reject non-essential technologies;
- records of consent may be maintained where appropriate.

EPTM LTD may implement consent-management mechanisms appropriate to the relevant website, application or digital service.

7. WITHDRAWING CONSENT

Where consent has been obtained, users shall be provided with an appropriate means of changing or withdrawing their consent.

Where technically available, users may revisit cookie preferences through the relevant consent-management interface made available on the applicable website, application or digital service.

Withdrawal does not affect processing that occurred lawfully before withdrawal.



8. THIRD-PARTY TECHNOLOGIES

EPTM LTD's digital services may incorporate third-party technology.

Examples may include:

- hosting services;
- analytics services;
- security services;
- application platforms;
- embedded content;
- communications systems;
- payment services.

Depending on the service used, third-party providers may include providers of:

- website hosting;
- cloud infrastructure;
- analytics and performance measurement;
- content delivery networks;
- cybersecurity services;
- payment processing;
- embedded media;
- customer communications.

Third parties may operate technologies according to their own privacy documentation.

9. MOBILE APPLICATIONS

Mobile applications may use technologies that perform functions similar to browser cookies, including SDKs and local storage.

The precise technologies used may depend on:

- the application platform;
 - device;
 - operating system;
 - enabled functionality;
 - third-party services.
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10. COOKIE MANAGEMENT

Users may control certain cookies through:

- cookie preference tools made available by EPTM LTD where implemented;
- browser settings;
- device settings;
- third-party opt-out mechanisms where available.

Blocking strictly necessary technologies may impair functionality.

Certain services may not operate correctly if required technologies are disabled.

11. PERSONAL DATA

Cookies and similar technologies may involve personal information.

Where this occurs, processing shall also be governed by:

- the EPTM LTD Global Privacy Policy;
 - applicable data-protection legislation;
 - applicable regulatory requirements.
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12. SECURITY

EPTM LTD seeks to ensure that cookies and similar technologies are deployed in a manner consistent with appropriate security measures.

Where reasonably practicable, EPTM LTD shall seek to:

- minimise unnecessary data collection;
 - limit access to authorised persons;
 - maintain appropriate technical and organisational safeguards;
 - review technologies periodically.
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13. POLICY UPDATES

EPTM LTD may update this Policy when:

- technology changes;
 - services change;
 - law changes;
 - regulatory guidance changes;
 - the EPTM LTD cookie inventory changes.
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14. GLOBAL APPLICATION

This Policy is designed as a global corporate policy.

UK law is the principal legal framework.

Where another jurisdiction, outside of the United Kingdom, imposes mandatory requirements concerning:

- cookies;
- electronic communications;
- consent;
- tracking;
- similar technologies;

those mandatory requirements shall prevail where applicable.

This Policy is intended to operate alongside applicable privacy, electronic communications, consumer protection and data-protection requirements.
